### **REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM THE DECEMBER 5, 2023 MEETING**

### **DISCUSSION AND PREPARATION OF THE BALLOT STATEMENT FOR THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTION OF ALABAMA OF 2022**

Chairman Moody opened the discussion by explaining the history of "sixteenth section lands" to educate the Commission on the background of the proposed constitutional amendment. Commissioners discussed revisions. After discussion, a motion was made to approve the final ballot statement as follows:

In the 1800's, Congress granted each township in the state certain land designated as "sixteenth section lands" and "indemnity lands" for the benefit of schools. Money earned from these lands is dedicated to the support and maintenance of the public schools in the state.

Currently, the Franklin County School System owns some sixteenth section lands and indemnity lands that are located in Fayette County and Walker County.

This amendment will transfer ownership rights of those lands to the Franklin County Board of Education. Upon approval, the amendment will provide that any money earned from the lease or sale of the lands or its natural resources will be paid to the Franklin County Board of Education.

Money currently held in trust by the State of Alabama prior to the approval of this amendment will continue to be held in trust and any money earned from those transactions will continue to be paid to the Franklin County Board of Education.

If the majority of voters vote “yes” on Amendment 1, the Alabama Constitution will be changed.

If the majority of voters vote “no” on Amendment 1, the Alabama Constitution will not be changed.

There are no costs or taxes related to Amendment 1.

The Constitutional authority for passage of Amendment 1 is set forth in accordance with Sections 284, 285 and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama. These sections outline the method a constitutional amendment may be put to the people of the State for a vote.

Commissioner Jones also noted the success of the publication of the proposed ballot statement from the Primary Election and the intention of the Secretary of State’s office to handle the publication of this proposed ballot statement in the same manner.

With no other further business coming before the Commission, Chairman Moody asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:25 a.m.


