This act authorizes the county commission to provide for its property and affairs; and for the public welfare, health and safety of its citizens throughout unincorporated areas of the county by exercising certain powers for the protection of the county and public property under its control, except as otherwise prohibited and/or defined by law. The powers to be exercised include: (1) Abatement of weeds as a public nuisance; (2) Control of animals and animal nuisances; (3) Control of litter or rubbish; (4) Control of junkyards which create a public nuisance because of an accumulation of items; and (5) Abatement of noise, unsanitary sewage, or pollution creating a public nuisance."</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>
